2017-2018 was the 32nd year for the **Class Acts** series of educational daytime performances, reaching over 629,000 attendees in that time.

- This year 14,209 attendees from 147 unique public, private, and home schools saw performances of 10 different shows.
- Following the performance of *The Great Gatsby*, the cast moderated a discussion with the students in the audience who shared what they noticed about the production, comparing it with the book and making connections with current social issues, especially relating to income inequality.
- Through the Seat Scholarship program, over 600 low-income students were able to see Class Acts performances at no cost to the schools or to the students' families.
- Thanks to designated donor gifts, students from Auburn, New Berlin, and Waverly school districts attended Class Acts performances at significantly reduced cost to the schools.









Through the **Grow Up Great** program, funded by PNC Bank:

- 550 preschool students in the Springfield Urban League Head Start program attended daytime performances of Nugget & Fang and Curious George.
- Head Start teachers received professional development training on integrating movement/dance with science.
- Nearly 300 Head Start students, staff, and family members attended a Family Night that included a performance by Terrance Simien & The Zydeco Experience.



As members of the John F. Kennedy Center for the Performing Arts' **Partners in Education** program, UIS Performing Arts Services works with Springfield Public Schools to offer workshops to help area teachers learn how to integrate the arts into their curriculum. Through workshops with nationally-recognized experts, local teachers have gained skills they use in the classroom to benefit hundreds of students.



Through the **ClassPass** program, 95 middle and high school students from 10 different schools attended select evening/weekend events at significantly reduced ticket prices.



- Members of the UIS Orchestra performed on stage with Black Violin during their tour stop at Sangamon Auditorium. The orchestra enjoyed a private rehearsal with Black Violin where they had an opportunity to directly interact with and learn from these innovative professionals.
- In connection with the performance by Mariachi Sol De Mexico, UIS Hispanic/Latinx student organizations (Organization of Latin American Students, Gamma Phi Omega Sorority, and Sigma Lambda Beta Fraternity) hosted a preshow dinner with educational presentations for area high school students, sharing information about Mexican culture, mariachi music, and their own personal experiences as Hispanic/Latinx students. The event was attended by 38 high school students and teachers from 6 different schools.

- Through the UIS Engaged Citizenship Common Experience Speaker Series, UIS students participated in unique educational experiences by attending and discussing performances.
 - Forty students attended the performance by Greek folk music ensemble Rebetiki Istoria and participated in a discussion about Greek culture and the influence of music on social justice, led by UIS professor Dr. Yona Stamatis, who is also a member of the ensemble.
 - Faculty from the UIS Department of Teacher Education led a discussion with 75 UIS students who attended the Class Acts performance of Freedom Riders. They discussed the importance of teaching topics involving populations that are often underrepresented or underserved, and they explored connections between the Freedom Riders movement and current social movements. The UIS student attendees also shared whether or not they were confronted with curriculum that addressed civic and social movements when they were they age of the typical attendees at this performance (grades 3-8).
- UIS Music students in the Camerata ensembles performed pre-show music in the lobby before the performances of Mariachi Sol De Mexico and Vitaly: A World of Wonders.







Community Engagement



Several events during the 2017-2018 season enabled us to provide activities for deeper engagement, designed to help our community explore artistic genres that are new to them and to facilitate opportunities to have more personal experiences with the performances. Ultimately, these activities will build future audiences who are excited to have new cultural experiences and who see the arts as an indispensable part of our community.

- Michael McBride, a member of Alvin Ailey
 American Dance Theater, led a masterclass for local modern dance students. Thirty-three dancers participated in the class about Horton-based modern technique, learning segments from "Revelations" and then participating in a
- Q&A session with Mr. McBride. At least four dance studio were represented, with the participants showing commitment to this opportunity since many had to be excused from school to attend. This special experience was made possible through the generous financial support of Chancellor and Mr. Koch.
- In conjunction with his performance on the Kitchen Sink Series, clarinetist Julian Bliss led a lecture/demonstration touching on the history of swing music and practice techniques for musicians of all skill levels. The group of 26 attendees ranged from elementary school students to local instrumental music teachers and semi-professional performers.



- Through a partnership with Girl Scouts of Central Illinois, 55 girls accompanied by 35 adults were able to learn about telling stories through movement before seeing the **Moscow Festival Ballet** perform *Sleeping Beauty*. This is the tenth consecutive year we have worked with the Girl Scouts.
- The Springfield International Folk Dancers added to the cultural atmosphere of the performance by **Rebetiki Istoria** by leading traditional Greek folk dances to the live music. The folk dancers appreciated the opportunity to learn from the musicians, and the members of Rebetiki Istoria appreciated the dancers' commitment to learning about their culture.
- For the family-friendly performance by Terrance Simien and the Zydeco Experience, we provided free pre-show activities in the lobby for all audience members, including creating musical instruments that could be used during the performance. Activities were led by Performing Arts Services staff, teachers from Black Hawk Elementary School, and the Youth Programs Coordinator from the Community Education department at Lincoln Land Community College.

MAY I SEE YOUR TICKET PLEASE?

During the 2017-2018 season, the Ticket Office distributed 85,171 tickets with a collective value of \$2,292,406 through our new ticketing software system. This new software has allowed for several upgrades that make the ticketing process more modern and convenient.

- Through the new online mobile and desktop ticketing process, ticket buyers experience a smoother and more user-friendly online ticket buying process.
- We are now offering tickets@home, through which patrons can purchase electronic tickets that can be accessed on a smart phone or printed at home.
- In conjunction with the new tickets@home, we have re-implemented scanning tickets at the entry doors, modernizing ticket use reports and helping staff better control access to events, cutting down on potential use of fraudulent tickets.
- The new software is now contained in the cloud; credit card data is not stored or even passed through the software, in keeping with the highest levels of Payment Card Industry compliance.

Along with continuing to provide ticketing services for The Muni and the Illinois Symphony Orchestra chamber concerts held at First Presbyterian Church, our Ticket Office is also now working with UIS Athletics to provide ticketing services for our UIS Prairie Stars NCAA Division II sports teams.

ALL THE WORLD IS A STAGE... AND IT NEEDED MAINTENANCE

In the spring of 2018, the two stage-level "star" dressing rooms were renovated, receiving new flooring, counters, lighting, and furniture. The worn-out spaces had not been upgraded since the building opened, and the institutional aesthetic was no longer welcoming for performers visiting Springfield. The idea for this project developed while Director Bryan Rives was giving a backstage tour to two long-time supporters of Sangamon Auditorium. When they saw the condition of the dressing rooms they offered to donate the amount needed to bring the spaces up to a "star quality" level. Great FRIENDS of UIS Performing Arts indeed! The two dressing rooms were also decorated with artwork created by Lanphier High School student Abbey Knoles. (see photo above)

Projects complete in 2017-18

- Various sections of carpet in the Auditorium replaced with a contrasting color to draw attention to changes in floor elevation
- Additional office space created out of an old storage area
- Maintenance service to the portable seating risers in the Studio Theatre
- Upgrades to the dimmer system for the theatrical lights in the Studio Theatre.
- Safety upgrades to stair railing in fire exits
- Repairs to the orchestra shell ceiling
- Engineering studies of how to improve rigging system of acoustical ceiling panels
- Comprehensive facility safety review
- Design concept for future lobby renovation (see photos above)

On September 30, 2017, Bob Vaughn retired after eleven years as the Director of Sangamon Auditorium. Bob presented over 200 events during his tenure and brought countless numbers of national and international artists to our community. His Kitchen Sink Series allowed our community to experience performers in the intimate setting of the UIS Studio Theatre, while in the larger Sangamon Auditorium his bookings of major Broadway shows and stars like Tony Bennett wowed audiences.

His office was not vacant for long. The next day Bryan Rives took the helm. Bryan holds a BFA in Theatre Production and a MA in Business/Arts Administration, which is combined with over 30 years' experience in performing arts management including leadership positions at Indiana University Auditorium, James H. Whiting Auditorium, Detroit Opera House, and other organizations.
